GENERAL INFORMATION FOR PASSENGERS CONDITIONS OF CARRIAGE AND REGULATIONS

RESERVATIONS AND CANCELLATIONS Seats should be reserved as far in advance as possible through any BEA Booking Office or Agent. If you have to cancel or defer your reservation, please let us know as early as possible and return your ticket. We cannot guarantee refund of fare for a reservation cancelled or transferred at short notice. A passenger failing either to cancel his reservation or to check-in in time to join the international flight on which he is booked will incur a forfeiture of 25 per cent. of the single fare (minimum forfeiture £2 or full fare if less than £2). If seats for a return journey cannot be reserved within the validity of a return ticket, the full one-way fare will apply to the outward journey and any application for refund will only be dealt with on this basis. Passengers travelling to Cyprus, or to points in the Middle East and North Africa, must re-confirm their return or onward reservations. You will be given full details when buying your ticket.

SKYCOTS Arrangements may be made in advance for Skycots to be available on BEA aircraft for infants of up to twelve months old. Skycots can be provided on certain Trident, Comet and Vanguard international flights of not less than ninety minutes duration, operating from and to London (Heathrow) Airport. Full details on request.

UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN Children may travel unaccompanied with the permission of their parent or guardian. In the child's interest, BEA requires that he/she be escorted to the airport of departure and met at the airport of arrival and that the names and addresses of the escorts be given at time of reservation.

BEA FLY/DRIVE Facilities are available at over 90 centres on the Continent and in a number of cities within the U.K. You can have a self-drive or chauffeur driven car awaiting you at the airport or your hotel. The charges vary according to country and make of car.

AIR/SEA TICKET INTERCHANGE There are arrangements with a number of steamship lines for the interchange of return tickets between the United Kingdom and various places abroad. Details may be obtained on application.

CURRENCY CONTROL The movement of money into and out of many countries is subject to Government control and you should consult your Travel Agent or Bank about regulations applicable to your journey well before the date of travel.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS It is the passenger's responsibility to ensure that the documents necessary for travel are in order, and the carrier cannot accept responsibility for the consequences of any irregularity.

Passports and Visas: Your passport, containing any necessary visas, will have to be shown during your journey, so please carry it; do not pack it!

The Passport Office recommends that applications for U.K. passports should whenever possible be made at least fourteen days before date of travel.

Health Certificates: Certain countries require valid certificates of inoculations and/or vaccination. Please enquire well in advance whether any such certificates are needed for your journey.

Passengers originating from Egypt, Israel, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco and Tunisia arriving in the U.K. must hold a valid certificate of vaccination against smallpox.

BAGGAGE Your baggage should contain personal effects only, but you may carry commercial samples, provided you arrange to be at the airport for international flights not later than the time specified by the local Customs; in the United Kingdom this is 40 minutes before aircraft departure time.

Prohibited Articles: Government regulations do not permit the carriage on aircraft of a number of articles including inflammable or explosive material, and you are asked not to carry with you or in your baggage things such as cylinders of compressed gas for picnic or camping stoves, cylinders of compressed air for use with aqualungs and underwater equipment, containers of lighter fuel, explosives including blank cartridges. On most BEA aircraft smoking is permitted and you may carry a box of safety matches or a lighter with you for use on the journey. (Cont. over)

CONDITIONS OF CARRIAGE AND REGULATIONS (Cont.)

Free Allowance: On International journeys (including Domestic sectors forming part of an International journey) the free allowance for each adult or child paying half the adult fare is:—
 Tourist class 44 lb. (20 kg.) First Class 66 lb. (30 kg.).

There are no free allowances for an infant carried at 10 per cent. of the adult fare, but infant's food for consumption en route and an infant's carrying basket are carried free of charge.

Personal Items: On BEA flights one underseat case to be stowed under the passenger seat may be carried as cabin baggage, provided its dimensions do not exceed 18" x 14" x 6". The weight of this case and of brief cases, typewriters, ladies' vanity cases and large cameras have to be included as part of the free baggage allowance under the regulations of the International Air Transport Association.

In addition to the free allowance, the following may be carried free of charge:

a lady's handbag, an overcoat, wrap or blanket, an umbrella or walking stick, a small camera, a pair of binoculars, a reasonable amount of reading matter for the flight, an invalid's fully collapsible wheel chair and/or a pair of crutches and/or braces or other prosthetic device for the passenger's use, provided that the passenger is dependent upon them.

Excess Weight: Baggage in excess of the free allowance may be carried subject to space being available, at the rates shown in this timetable.

Unaccompanied Baggage: By arrangement with BEA Cargo Offices, unaccompanied baggage may be sent as cargo at normal cargo rates. In addition customs clearance, handling and/or cartage charges are payable.

N.B. For journeys wholly on BEA U.K. Domestic flights different baggage regulations apply. For details see British Isles timetable.

CAMERAS The use of cameras in aircraft is subject to restrictions over some countries. If you wish to take photographs from the air please ask the steward.

PORTABLE ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT Passengers on BEA aircraft may use hearing aids, heart pacemakers, portable dictating machines or tape recorders provided these are not used for playing music through a loudspeaker. The use of all other forms of portable electronic equipment including radio sets, is not allowed, because of possible interference with the aircraft's radio equipment.

INSURANCE Under the Conditions of Carriage BEA accepts no liability for the loss of jewellery and money contained in checked (registered) baggage. You are advised to keep valuable articles and money either on your person or in your hand baggage. You can purchase Personal and Baggage Insurance at BEA offices in the United Kingdom and in most countries abroad.
