GENERAL INFORMATION

AIR EXPRESS — All flights carry Air Express. Special door-to-door pickup and delivery afforded by Air Express Division of the Railway Express Agency, Inc., New International Air Express Service to Monterey and Mexico City.

AIR MAIL — All flights carry Air Mail.

BAGGAGE — Forty (40) pounds of baggage will be carried free on any domestic ticket. The term "baggage" shall mean all luggage including briefcases, portfolios, parcels, sleeper envelopes, camera equipment and similar articles whether carried in the cabin or checked in cargo compartment. Excess baggage carried upon special arrangements and at the rate per pound of one-half of one per cent of the published air passenger fare, subject to a minimum charge of twenty-five cents, and the liability of the Carrier for loss of or damage to baggage and/or personal property is limited to the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) unless a higher valuation is declared and an additional charge paid therefor. Excess valuation limited to \$2,500.00 on each full fare ticket. 55 pounds of baggage will be carried free on tickets of passengers to and from Mexico. Inquire of ticket agent for full details.

CAMERAS — Due to wartime restrictions, no cameras may be carried into the cabin of American Airlines' Airplanes.

CHILDREN — One child under two years of age, not occupying a seat, will be carried free with each accompanying passenger twelve years of age or over.

EQUIPMENT — All American Airlines' flights are operated with Douglas 21-passenger "Flagship Club" Airplanes. Equipment is scheduled to operate through, as shown in the Tables.

FARES — All fares are shown herein for information purposes only, and are subject to correction and change without notice. Official tariffs are on file and open for public inspection at any American Airlines office.

FOUNTAIN PENS, LIQUIDS, ETC. — Due to changes in atmospheric pressure, fountain pens and other liquid containers have a tendency to leak. Usually all that is necessary is to screw the caps on tightly. However, it is advisable to securely wrap pens and containers, when placed in handbags, to insure against damage to other articles.

GENERAL — The use of alcoholic beverages is not permitted on planes.

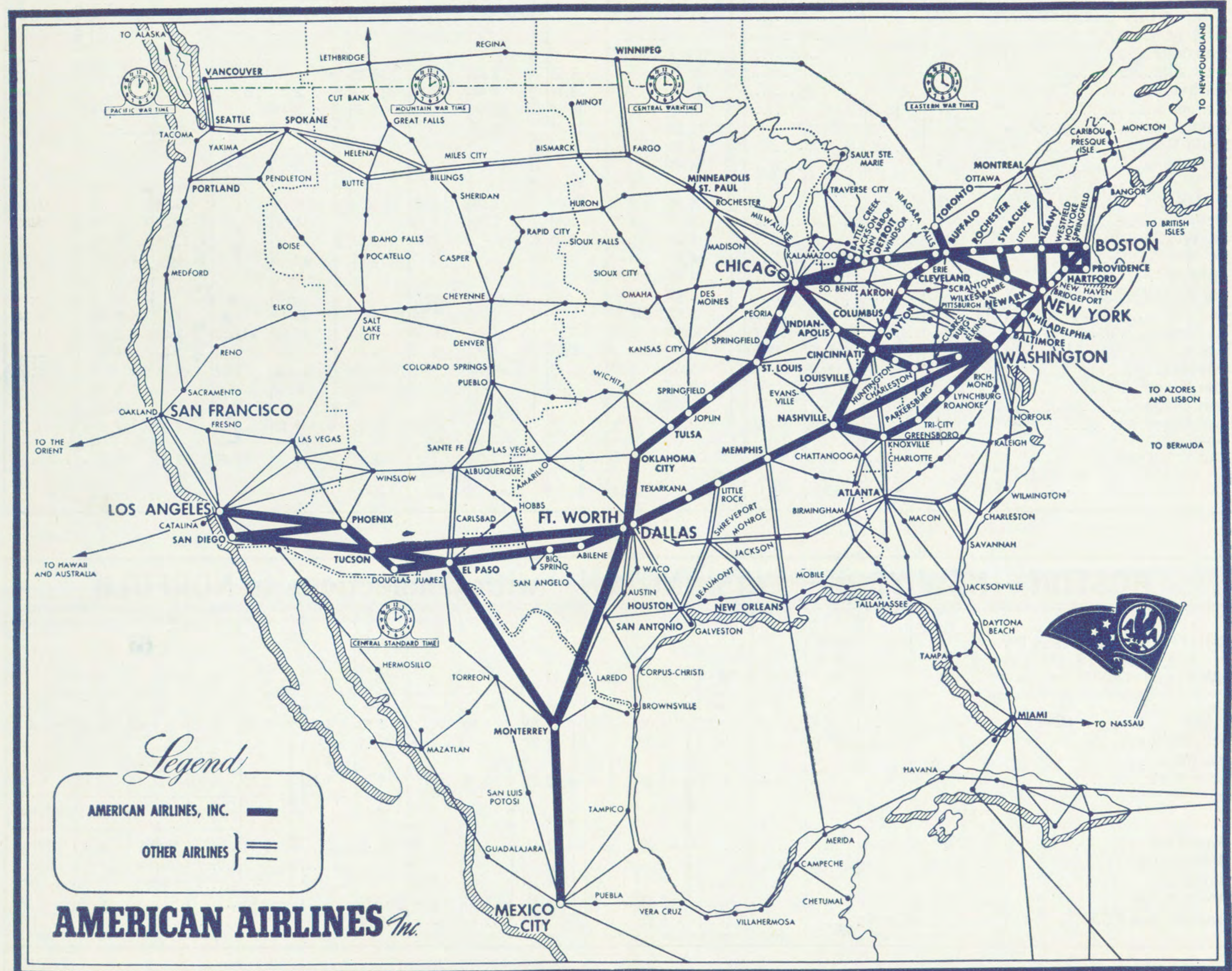
GROUND TRANSPORTATION — American Airlines has arranged ground transportation services at reasonable rates in all cities it serves. See Page 11. Passengers using their own transportation direct to the airport are requested to report to the ticket agent at least ten (11) minutes before plane departure time. Passengers must arrive at airports for International flights at least 30 minutes prior to scheduled departure.

INSURANCE — Trip insurance is available at all airline offices.

MEALS — All meals served aloft are complimentary.

PASSAGE CANCELLATION BY COMPANY — The Company reserves the right to cancel bookings before passage or enroute. Captain may remove passengers from plane at any point on the route for safety or other cause. In any event the passenger's sole recourse shall be recovery of that portion of the fare equal to the distance untraveled.
