GENERAL INFORMATION

AIR CARGO - INTERNATIONAL — Direct service is available to Mexico and Europe with connections to world-wide destinations. Inquire at any American Airlines office for additional information and rates.

AIRFREIGHT — Fast, economical service is available to cities in both the United States and Canada. For information regarding rates and pickup and delivery service call any American Airlines office.

AIR EXPRESS — All flights carry Air Express. Special door-to-door pickup and delivery available. Call the Air Express Division of any Railway Express Agency office.

AIR MAIL AND INTERNATIONAL AIR PARCEL POST — All domestic and international flights carry Air Mail. All transatlantic flights carry International Air Parcel Post. Domestic Air Mail - 5 cents an ounce. European Air Mail - 15 cents one-half ounce. Consult your local Post Office for detailed information and for the new reasonable International Air Parcel Post rates and service to many European and Scandinavian countries.

BAGGAGE — Following rules apply to all except Mexico and Overseas passengers: **Free Allowance** within the United States and Canada, 40 pounds;

Excess baggage may be accepted, space and weight permitting at the rate of 1/2 of one per cent of the one-way adult fare per pound.

Liability of Carrier limited to \$100.00 unless a higher valuation is declared and an additional charge paid therefor in advance. Total valuation limited to \$25,000.00 on each full fare ticket.

PETS — (tame animals or birds) will be carried, except in Convair Flagships, as excess baggage at owner's risk and subject to tariff regulations.

CANCELLATION BY COMPANY — The company reserves the right to cancel bookings before passage or en route. Captain may remove passengers from plane at any point on the route for safety or other cause. In any event the passenger's sole recourse shall be recovery of that portion of the fare equal to the distance untraveled.

CANCELLATION BY PASSENGER — The purchaser may receive a refund for unused transportation providing reservation is cancelled prior to departure.

CHILDREN — Children under twelve years of age will be charged one-half the adult fare, except that one child under two years of age, not occupying a seat, will be carried free with each accompanying passenger twelve years of age or over.

EQUIPMENT — All passenger flights in the United States, Canada and Mexico are operated with 300 M.P.H. 5-Star Flagships (DC-6), 300 M.P.H. Convair Flagships and 240 M.P.H. Flagships (DC-4) and are specifically indicated. All other flights are operated with Douglas DC-3 Flagships.

Flights on the Overseas route are operated with Douglas DC-4 Flagships and Lockheed Constellation Flagships.

FARES — All fares are shown herein for information purposes only, and are subject to correction and change without notice. Official tariffs are on file and open for public inspection at any American Airlines office.

FRAGILE AND PERISHABLE ARTICLES — Fragile and perishable articles are carried at the risk of the passenger.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION — Ground transportation service is available at reasonable rates in all cities served by American Airlines. (See Page 4.) Passengers using their own transportation direct to the airport are requested to report to the ticket agent at least ten minutes before plane departure time on domestic flights.

INSURANCE — Trip insurance is available at all airlines offices.

MEALS — Meals are served aloft during meal periods at no additional charge.

REFUNDS — In the United States, Canada and Mexico requests for your refunds on tickets issued on American Airlines should be addressed to the Manager of Auditing, American Airlines Inc. 910 South Boston, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and in Europe they should be addressed to the European Traffic Manager, American Overseas Airlines, Inc., 15 Hill Street, London, England.

RESERVATIONS — American Airlines welcomes advance reservations. Reservations for unticketed passengers will be held only for a reasonable time; if a passenger fails to purchase his ticket by the "time limit" agreed upon, the reservation will be cancelled and resold.

STEWARDESSES — Stewardess service is provided on all American Airlines flights.

STOP-OVER — Stop-overs will be allowed at any regular stop, provided reservation is made accordingly.

TAXES — Any taxes imposed by Governmental authority are in addition to transportation fare, and will be collected wherever effective.

TIME TABLES — These time tables show the time at which planes may be expected to depart from and arrive at the stations shown herein, and to connect with trains or other planes, but their departure, arrival, or connection at the time stated is not guaranteed. American Airlines reserves the right to vary from the time shown in this publication without notice to the public.

UNSCHEDULED LANDINGS — So that maximum amount of space be made available on all flights for the transportation of passengers and cargo, it will occasionally be necessary to make unscheduled landings at intermediate airports enroute for fuel.

INTERNATIONAL PASSENGERS

PASSPORTS, ETC. — Passengers on international flights must possess all documents required by the laws of the countries from, into or over which they are to fly and should any required documents be missing, passage may be denied. The following documents are required by United States Citizens proceeding to country of destination without stop-over:

To Denmark, Netherlands, Norway, Sweden } U. S. Passport only, No Visas required
To Finland, Iceland, Ireland, United Kingdom } U. S. Passport and appropriate Visas

To Canada, Newfoundland } Proof of U.S. citizenship

To Mexico: For a pleasure trip, proof of U. S. citizenship, Mexican Tourist Card, Smallpox Vaccination Certificate if returning to the U. S. For business trip, U. S. Passport, Mexican Visa, appropriate Mexican Immigration form prescribed by Mexican Consul, Smallpox Vaccination Certificate required.

To Germany: U. S. Passport, Military Entry Permit, Inoculation Certificate for Smallpox required of all passengers. Certificates for Typhus, Typhoid and Paratyphoid, also Diphtheria (if between ages of 6 months and 35 years and not immune) required for military personnel and civilians on military or governmental business, and recommended but not mandatory for all others.

Documentary requirements are subject to change without notice. The above are given for information only and American Airlines will not be responsible for any failure of passengers to comply with governmental requirements in force at the time of their passage.

BAGGAGE — Canada passengers refer to left hand column, this page. For Mexico and Overseas passengers: **Free Baggage allowance** is 66 pounds. **Excess Baggage** may be accepted, space and weight permitting, at the rate of 1% of the one way adult fare, per kilo (2.21 pounds). **Liability of Carrier** is limited to \$100.00 unless a higher valuation is declared and paid for at the rate of 15 cents per \$100.00 or fraction thereof. Total valuation limited to \$5000.00. Baggage may also be sent "The Sutherland Way" a door-to-door, all inclusive-cost system for shipping bulky or unusually heavy gear ahead to await you in Europe. This convenient low-cost service takes care of all details — permits, customs clearance, insurance, etc.

PETS — (tame animals or birds) will not be accepted for carriage as baggage between the United States and points on Overseas Routes.

CHECK-IN AT PORT OF EMBARKATION — Passengers must arrive sufficiently in advance of the scheduled departure of aircraft to permit checking of their baggage and the completion of governmental and other formalities. Passengers on overseas flights must arrive at airport of embarkation at least one hour before scheduled departure. Flights will not be delayed for passengers who arrive too late and the carrier shall not be liable to any such passenger except to refund a portion of the fare in accordance with tariff provisions. Passengers holding return reservations from Mexico, whether ticketed or not, must contact by phone, wire, or in person the American Airlines offices in Mexico City or Monterrey not later than 24 hours prior to scheduled departure or it will be assumed that they wish their return reservations to be cancelled.

Overseas passengers holding return reservations from Europe or the United States must contact by phone, wire or in person the American Airlines Office in the originating city for the return passage at least 72 hours prior to scheduled departure time of their flight or it will be assumed that they wish their reservation to be cancelled.

CHILDREN — One child under two years of age, not occupying a seat, will be carried with each accompanying passenger twelve years of age or over:

To Mexico and Canada free of charge.
To Europe and/or return, 10% of one way or round trip adult fare from or to Boston, Chicago, Detroit, New York, Philadelphia or Washington depending on point of origin or destination in the United States.

Children in excess of one accompanying a passenger twelve years of age or over, and all children over two but under twelve will be charged one-half the applicable fares published in International Tariffs.

CURRENCY RESTRICTIONS — Passengers to countries other than Canada or Mexico should not carry United States currency in denominations larger than \$50.00 bills. Many European and Latin American countries prohibit the importation of more than \$50.00 or equivalent in any currency. It is strongly recommended that all funds of international travelers be converted into Travelers checks, bank drafts, letter of credit, or other similar financial paper.

CUSTOMS DUTIES ON BAGGAGE — Baggage of International travelers will be examined by customs officers of each country on arrival. Used personal articles intended for use while traveling are generally admitted free of duty. However, any merchandise for sale, gifts, samples or anything being carried for other persons will be subject to duty.

Residents of the United States are permitted to bring back, duty free, \$100.00 in merchandise acquired outside United States, provided the traveler has been away from United States more than 48 hours (except to Mexico where no minimum time is prescribed) and further provided that this free allowance is claimed not oftener than once in thirty days. This merchandise must be for the traveler's own personal use or for the personal use of immediate members of his family. \$300 worth additional allowance per resident can be claimed duty-free not oftener than once every 6 months and provided the passenger has been out of the U.S. for at least 12 days.

Important — If exemption is to be claimed on any merchandise not moving on the same plane with the passenger, the customs declaration must be filled out in duplicate. This applies to all unaccompanied articles, whether followed by later plane or moving surface transportation.

RESERVATIONS — Reservations requests must include the following information:
1. Passenger's name.
2. Citizenship.

TAXES — Mexican transportation tax, varying from \$.46 to \$2.72 depending on value of ticket, will be assessed at time return reservations are checked.
