DEPARTURES

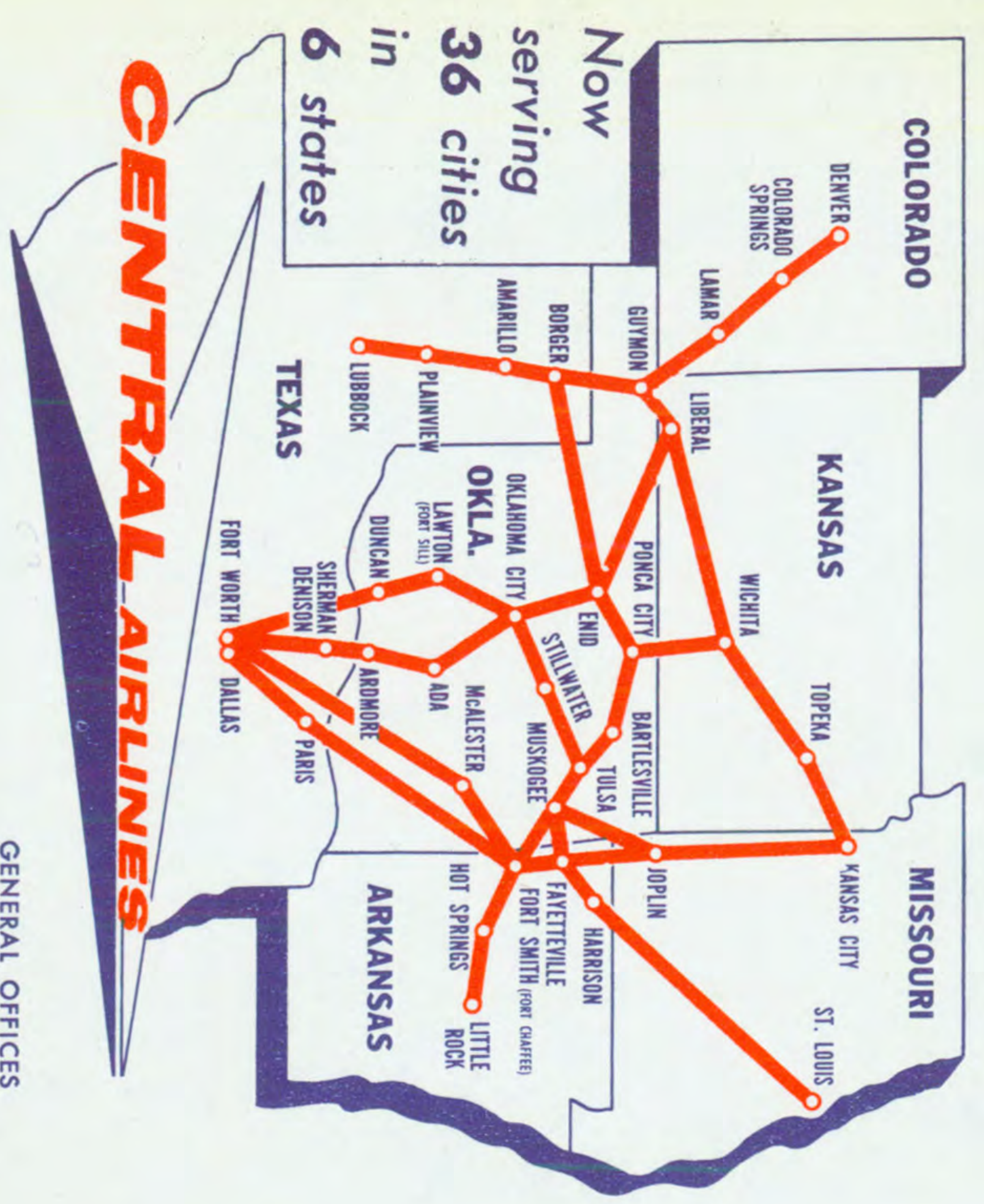
