

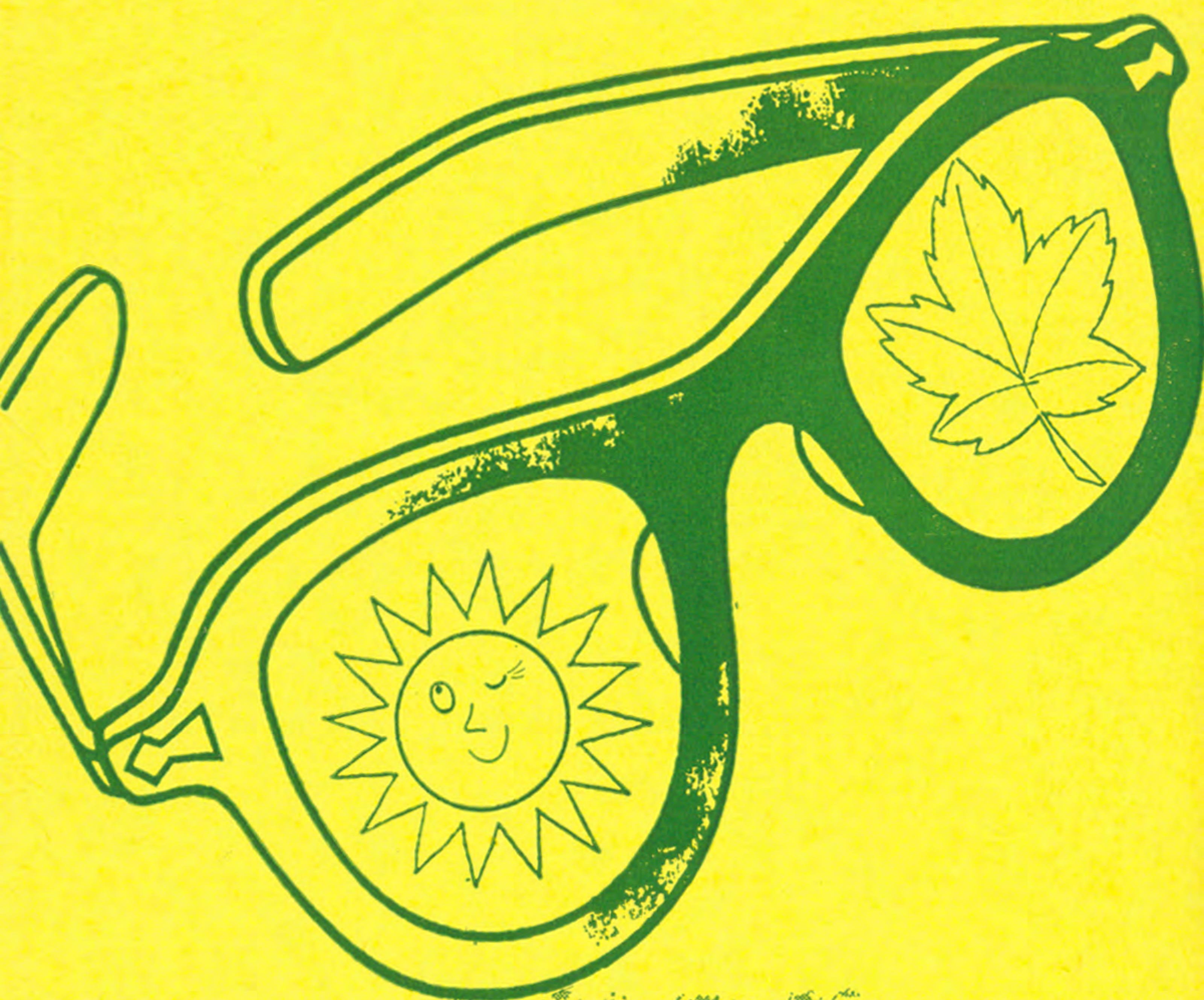

## GENERAL INFORMATION

**BAGGAGE AND PERSONAL PROPERTY** — Passengers are permitted a free baggage allowance of 40 pounds when traveling within the United States and Canada. 66 pounds of baggage will be carried free when traveling between any point on Colonial Airlines and Bermuda. The liability of the company for loss of, or damage to, baggage and other personal property is limited to \$100, unless a higher valuation is declared in advance and an additional charge is paid. The company is not responsible for any personal property which is not delivered into its custody.

**CUSTOM AND IMMIGRATION** — International passengers are subject to customs and immigration examinations.

**EQUIPMENT** — 21-passenger DC-3 aircraft operated in United States Canada service. 44-passenger DC-4 aircraft operated in United States Bermuda Service.

**FARES** — All fares are applicable only for transportation between airports, and are subject to change without notice. Ground transportation between airport and city is available at passenger's expense.

**RESERVATIONS** — All seats are reserved. Advance reservations are welcomed and will be held until time agreed upon for purchase of tickets.

All reservations on other than originating flight from city where ticket is purchased are subject to cancellation, unless passenger contacts reservation office at city of departure at least 6 hours prior to scheduled flight departure time or within 30 minutes after arrival by air at such city.

The company may cancel any reservation when such action is necessary for safety or other cause, and the passenger's sole recourse shall be recovery of the refund value of the ticket.

**SCHEDULE** — All flights schedules are subject to change or cancellation without notice.

New York flights arrive and depart from Gate 15, Domestic Terminal, La Guardia Field.

### Interesting Observations

For the futurist, 250,545,622 passenger miles (mileage accumulated during Colonial's unprecedented safety record now starting its 20th consecutive year) would be equivalent to one person making more than 1000 trips to the moon. (The distance to the moon is estimated by the World Almanac to be approximately 238,857 miles.)

The entire population of Bermuda could be flown from the coral isles to New York and return, about 4 times, before 250,545,622 passenger miles would be equalled.
