On ATA You're On Vacation

Information provided below is excerpted from rules applicable to transportation provided by American Trans Air. The full text of the Contract of Carriage may be inspected at the carrier's ticket office, or a copy may be requested free of charge by writing to American Trans Air, Consumer Affairs Dept., P.O. Box 51609, Indianapolis, IN 46251.

Aircraft

American Trans Air utilizes Boeing 727-200, 757-200, and Lockheed L1011 wide-body aircraft.

Schedules

Schedules are subject to change without notice, and times shown in American Trans Air timetables or elsewhere are not guaranteed and form no part of the Contract of Carriage. Schedules shown are based on expected flying times. Because weather and other factors may affect operating conditions, departures and arrivals cannot be guaranteed. The carrier is not responsible or liable for missed connections, or for failing to operate any flight according to schedule or for changing the schedule of any flight. Certain flights may not operate during holiday periods. Contact American Trans Air for details.

Check-in Procedures

Passengers should check-in one hour prior to scheduled departure for domestic flights and two hours prior for international flights. All passengers must be present in the boarding area at least ten minutes prior to scheduled departure for domestic flights, and 30 minutes prior for international flights, even if they have already appeared at another location designated for passenger check-in. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of a passenger's reservation for all segments in his/her itinerary and make the passenger ineligible for denied boarding compensation, seat assignments and international travel.

International Travel- An international trip may require valid travel documents such as a passport, visa, reentry permit, health certificate, inoculation record or a ticket for the return journey or the continuing trip. The responsibility for the proper documentation rests with the individual passenger. Contact American Trans Air for details.

Seat Assignments-All seating assignments are given at time of check-in on a first-come, first-served basis.

Overbooking of Flights

In the unlikely event a flight is oversold, passengers holding a confirmed ticket will not be denied a seat until volunteers have been requested. If there are not enough volunteers, the airline will deny boarding to other persons in accordance with established boarding priorities. With few exceptions, passengers denied boarding involuntarily and who have complied with American Trans Air's check-in requirements are entitled to compensation. Details regarding compensation are available at airport ticket counters.

Baggage

Checked baggage should be locked. Regulations require name identification on the outside. We recommend placing identification on the inside of luggage as well. Name labels are available at American Trans Air ticket counters. Checked baggage is subject to inspection and you may be required to present identification to claim your baggage. Do not place currency, securities or other negotiable instruments, business documents, jewelry, camera/electronic equipment, medication or other valuable or irreplaceable articles in checked baggage. Such items should be carried personally because the carrier accepts no responsibility or liability for these items in case of loss or delay. Articles which are unsuitably packed, fragile and/or perishable will be accepted as checked baggage at passenger's own risk.

Free Baggage Allowance-A maximum of two checked pieces and one carry-on item per ticketed passenger is allowed free of charge. Each piece must conform to the dimensions and weight restrictions established by American Trans Air. Baggage will be assessed an excess fee for oversized and/or overweight pieces and for additional pieces over the free baggage allowance. Separate charges will apply to special items such as bicycles, scuba gear, surfboards, etc. and are subject to space availability.

Carry-On-Baggage-Each ticketed passenger is allowed one piece of carry-on baggage provided it can be stowed under a seat or in an overhead compartment. Items such as umbrellas, hand-bags, cameras, overcoats and briefcases will not be counted toward the one piece.

Baggage Liability-Unless excess value is declared and charges paid at the time of check-in, American Trans Air's baggage liability for damaged or lost baggage is limited to \$1250 per ticketed passenger for travel wholly between U.S. points and \$9.07 per pound of checked baggage for International travel. In addition, American Trans Air is not liable for scratches, dents or other marks arising from normal baggage handling and transporting. Damaged or lost baggage must be reported, in person, within four hours of customer's arrival at destination.

Animals

Small domestic animals which are kept as personal pets may be transported on domestic flights. These animals may accompany the passenger in the cabin provided they are transported in a suitable kennel and can fit beneath a seat. Animals may also be carried in a suitable kennel in the temperature controlled and pressurized cargo compartment for a nominal fee. Assistance animals trained to aid persons with impaired vision and/or hearing may accompany the passenger on domestic or international flights. Transportation of all animals is subject to restrictions and space availability.

Firearms

Federal regulations permit the transportation of firearms as checked baggage only. Firearms must be unloaded and in an approved case, and must be declared in writing at the time of check-in. Contact American Trans Air for regulations regarding transportation of firearms.

Hazardous Materials

Federal regulations restrict the carriage on aircraft of items classified as hazardous materials. These materials include, but are not limited to: flammable gases, liquids and solids; non-flammable compressed gas; explosives; poisons; corrosive; oxidizing materials; radioactive substances; etiologic agents and magnetic materials. These materials may not be carried in checked or carry-on baggage; violators are subject to substantial fines.

Smoking Regulations

Federal regulations prohibit smoking on all flights scheduled for 6 hours or less in length which originate in the U.S. and terminate in the North American continent. Cigar or pipe smoking is prohibited on all flights.

On-Board Service

American Trans Air serves complimentary coffee, juices, soft drinks and nuts on all flights. Cocktails, beer and wine are available for a nominal charge. Meal service will vary by length of flight and time of departure. Consult timetable for details.

Special Passenger Requests

American Trans Air is able to provide special assistance to families traveling with children or infants, children traveling alone and handicapped, disabled or elderly passengers. For more information on the types of assistance provided, please call the listed Reservations number.

Children

One child under two (2) years of age, not occupying a seat, will be carried free of charge on domestic flights with a passenger paying the applicable adult fare.

Credit Cards & Check Acceptance

American Trans Air accepts Mastercard and Visa. Personal checks made payable to American Trans Air for exact amount of purchase must include imprinted name, mailing address and telephone number. A valid driver's license with picture (or valid passport) is required.

Ticket By Mail

Tickets purchased through American Trans Air Reservations can be mailed directly to your home or place of business. Fares are guaranteed once the ticket is issued, provided no itinerary changes are made.

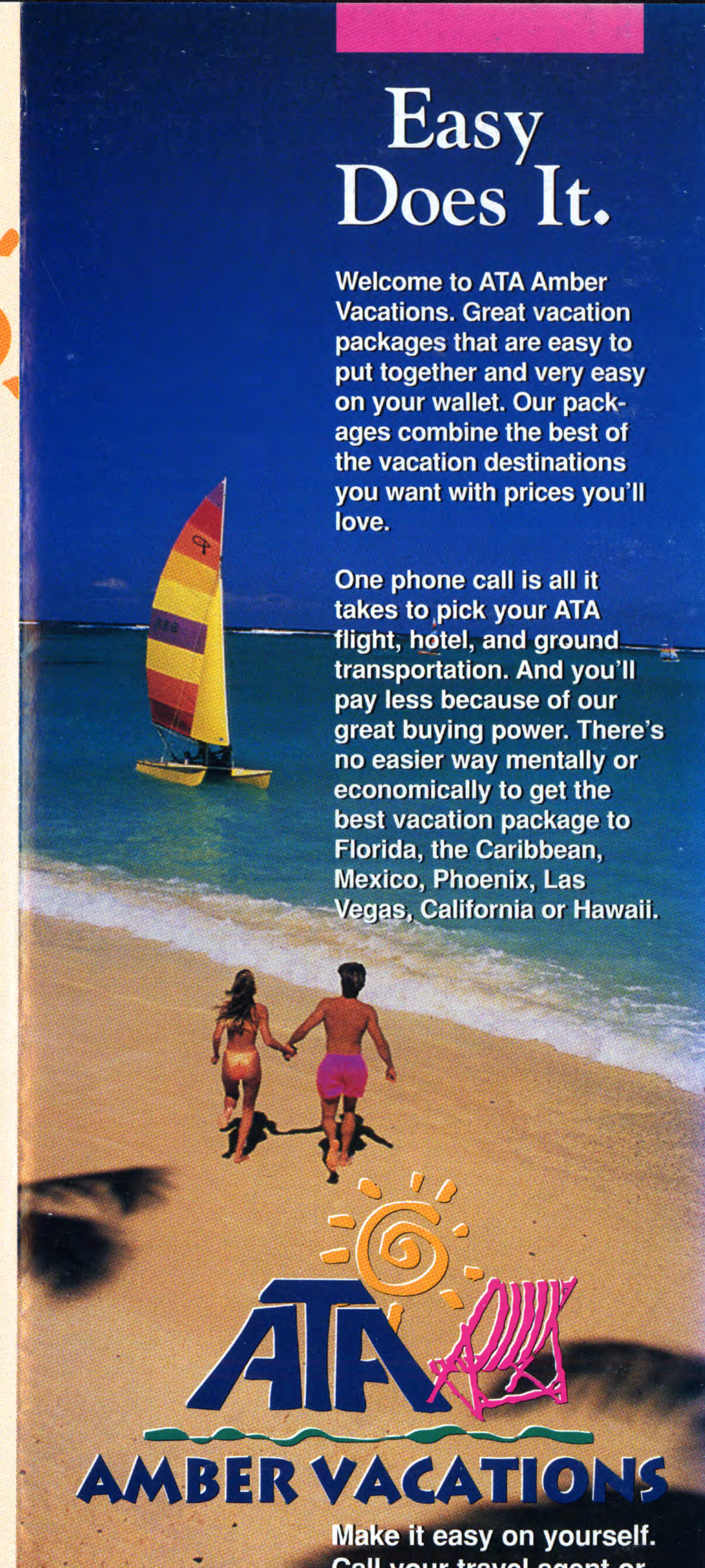
