The information below is from rules applicable to transportation provided by ATA. The full text of the Contract of Carriage may be inspected at the carrier's ticket offices, or a copy may be requested free of charge by writing to ATA, Customer Services Dept., P.O. Box 51609, Indianapolis, IN 46251.

Aircraft

ATA utilizes Boeing 727-200, 757-200, and Lockheed-1011 widebody aircraft. ATA Connection utilizes British Aerospace, Jetstream 31 aircraft.

Schedules

Schedules are subject to change without notice, and times shown in ATA timetables or elsewhere are not guaranteed and form no part of the Contract of Carriage. Schedules shown are based on expected flying times. Because weather and other factors may affect operating conditions, departures and arrivals cannot be guaranteed. The carrier is not responsible or liable for failing to operate any flight according to schedule or for changing the schedule of any flight. Contact ATA for details.

Check-in Procedures

In addition to security directives issued by the FAA, ATA has its own enhanced security program, requiring customers who appear 18 years or older to provide a state or federal government issued ID at check-in. We encourage all customers to arrive at the airport **earlier** than the standard check-in time. (Standard check-in time is at least one hour prior to scheduled departure for domestic flights and two hours prior for international flights.) All customers must be present in the boarding area at least 20 minutes prior to scheduled departure for domestic flights, and 30 minutes prior for international flights, even if they have already appeared at another location designated for customer check-in. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of a customer's reservation for all segments in his/her itinerary and make the customer ineligible for denied boarding compensation.

An **international trip** may require valid travel documents such as a passport, visa, re-entry permit, health certificate, inoculation record or a ticket for the return or continuing journey. The responsibility for proper documentation rests with the individual customer. Contact ATA for details.

All **seating assignments** are made at time of reservation, or at check-in on a first-come, first-served basis.

Overbooking of Flights

In the unlikely event a flight is oversold, customers holding a confirmed ticket will not be denied a seat until volunteers have been requested. If there are not enough volunteers, the airline will deny boarding to other persons in accordance with established boarding priorities. With few exceptions, customers denied boarding involuntarily and who have complied with ATA's check-in requirements are entitled to compensation. Details are available at airport ticket counters.

Baggage

Checked baggage should be locked. Regulations require name identification on the outside. We recommend placing identification on the inside of baggage as well. Name labels are available at ATA ticket counters. Checked baggage is subject to inspection and customers may be required to present identification to claim their baggage. Do not place keys, currency, securities or other similar valuable items, business documents, jewelry, camera/electronic/video equipment, medications, prescriptions or other irreplaceable articles in checked baggage. Such items should be carried personally by the customer. Fragile or perishable items will be checked only at customer's own risk.

Free Baggage Allowance: ATA accepts three pieces of baggage at no charge. Bags must be in compliance with ATA dimensional restrictions noted.

Combined checked and carry-on free allowance baggage is as follows:

- B727/B757:**
 - 1 piece checked, 2 carry-on maximum or
 - 2 pieces checked, 1 carry-on or
 - 3 pieces checked, 0 carry-on
 - Carry-on dimensions: 9" x 15" x 22" (23cm x 38cm x 56cm)
- L1011:**
 - 2 pieces checked, 1 carry-on maximum or
 - 3 pieces checked, 0 carry-on
 - Carry-on dimensions: 9" x 13.5" x 19" (23cm x 34cm x 48cm)

Carry-on Baggage: Carry-on items are subject to operational limits and must fit underneath your seat or in an overhead storage compartment. Items such as umbrellas, handbags, cameras and overcoats will not be counted as carry-on baggage.

Checked Baggage:

- Dimensions:** Maximum bag sizes are measured by linear dimensions (length+width+height=linear inches allowed)
 - First checked bag may be 62"
 - Second checked bag may be 55"
 - Third checked bag may be 45"

Flights within the Continental U.S., Mexico, Caribbean, Hawaii:

- Maximum three pieces
- Not to exceed 70 lbs. per piece
- Total allowed weight is 140 lbs. per ticketed customer

Trans-Atlantic Flights

- Maximum two pieces
- Total allowed weight is 44 lbs. per ticketed customer

Baggage Liability: On domestic flights, ATA's liability for baggage loss, damage or delay is limited to \$1,250 per ticketed customer. For most international travel (including domestic portions of international journeys) ATA's liability is limited to approximately \$9.07 per pound (\$20 per kilo) for checked baggage (not to exceed 2 bags and \$640 per bag) and \$400 per ticketed customer for carry-on bags. Maximum liability, unless excess weight is noted and additional charges paid, is limited to free weight allowance.

Animals

Small domestic animals which are kept as pets may be transported on domestic flights for a fee. Assistance animals trained to aid persons with impaired vision and/or hearing may accompany the customer on domestic or international flights. Transportation of animals is subject to restrictions and space availability. Contact ATA for more information and pet fees.

Firearms

Federal regulations permit the transportation of firearms as checked baggage only. Firearms must be unloaded, in an approved case, and declared in writing at the time of check-in. Contact ATA for regulations regarding transportation of firearms.

Hazardous Materials

Federal regulations restrict the carriage of items classified as hazardous material when transported by aircraft. These items may include, but are not limited to: acid, matches, flammable liquids/solids/gases, explosives, oxidizing materials, corrosive materials, compressed gases or propellants, portable compressed oxygen bottles (including those designed for personal medical use and those for scuba diving), poisons, etiologic agents, radioactive materials, irritating or incapacitating sprays. These materials are not permitted in either checked or carry-on baggage.

Smoking Regulations

Smoking is prohibited on all ATA flights.

On-Board Service

On flights lasting one hour or longer in duration, ATA serves complimentary coffee, juices, and soft drinks. Cocktails, beer and wine are available for a nominal charge. Meal service will vary by length of flight and time of departure.

Special Requests

ATA is able to provide special assistance to families traveling with children or infants, children traveling alone, and disabled or elderly customers. For more information on the types of assistance provided, please call the listed reservations number.

Children

One child under two (2) years of age, not occupying a seat, will be carried free of charge on domestic flights when traveling with a customer over twelve (12) years of age, paying the applicable adult fare.

Credit Cards & Check Acceptance

ATA accepts Mastercard, Visa, Diners Club, Discover and American Express. Personal checks made payable to ATA for exact amount of purchase must include imprinted name, mailing address and telephone number. A valid driver's license with picture (or valid passport) is required when purchasing tickets in person with a check.

Ticket By Mail

Tickets purchased through ATA Reservations can be mailed directly to your home or place of business. Fares are guaranteed once the ticket is issued, provided no itinerary changes are made.

Groups

Specializing in groups of 10 or more people, ATA's Group Department assists with group travel plans for business or pleasure to ensure groups have a smooth trip. Call your travel agent or ATA's Group Desk at 800-543-3715.

Refund or Lost Tickets
