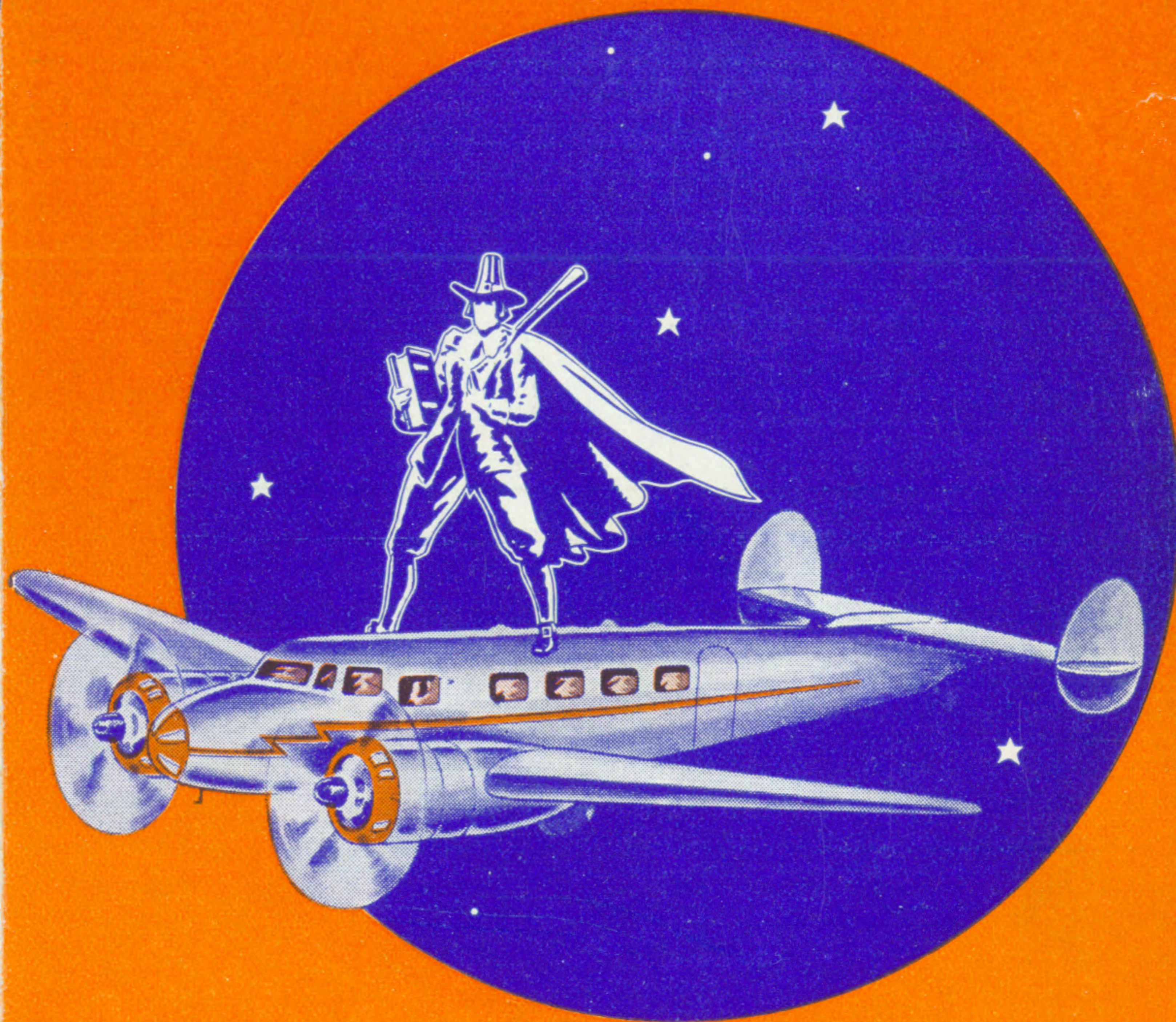

Before you've left home, the Captain and First Officer have completed a flight plan. This form, prepared and studied by experts, is a carefully worked out schedule of times, altitudes, power utilization, and — as a double check, alternate courses.

Every hour — night and day — from land and sea observing stations hundreds of reports come into BOSTON-MAINE AIRWAYS Flight Control office by radio and teletype. Every six hours the U. S. Weather Bureau issues a map of weather conditions over the entire continent. Detailed forecasts are issued for each terminal and route in addition to a general forecast. This information is supplemented by reports from crews of other flights in the air at the time your flight is being planned. With this complete knowledge your flight crew selects the smoothest altitude at which to fly, the amount of power to be drawn from the engines, the exact course to be flown, and the time required for each portion of the flight. The completed flight plan must be examined by the Flight Superintendent before he approves the flight. All East and Northbound ships must fly at odd altitudes, 3000', 5000', 7000' etc. while South and Westbound ships must fly at even altitudes, 2000', 4000', 6000', to evade any close operation of ships flying in opposite directions. On every route "check points" are designated and when a flight passes over a "check" the crew reports by radio the exact time, altitude, flying conditions, and estimated arrival over the next "check" or at the next stop. All this information is tabulated by ground station operators as well as the ships in the air. At any time a flight crew may communicate by radio with any other flight or with any of the ground stations located at each station on the route.

BOSTON-MAINE AIRWAYS Lockheed Airliners cruise at three miles per minute along the boundaries of the latest type radio ranges (definite continuously signalled sound highways of the sky) which guide your flight straight to its destination.

In addition to regular two way radiophone equipment and radio range receivers BOSTON-MAINE AIRWAYS Lockheed Airliners are equipped with radio direction finding equipment with which the Captain or First Officer may take bearings on any radio stations and double check the position of the flight in a few seconds.

BOSTON-MAINE AIRWAYS Operations Staff has developed a radio compass position indicator which enables flight control offices and other ground stations to plot the position of every flight. The radio compass position indicator gives a definite check on the flight crews' calculations as well as enabling flight control offices to determine the speed, the path of a flight, and wind direction and velocity at the particular altitudes at which the flights are operating.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ANIMALS—Pets will be accepted as excess baggage under certain conditions. Consult Boston-Maine Airways Agent.

BAGGAGE—Forty (40) pounds of baggage will be carried free on any ticket. For a man — or a woman — this means sufficient clothing for 3 to 6 days. The average bag weighs only 5 to 8 Pounds, carries 25 to 35 Pounds of clothing and accessories. Excess baggage carried upon special arrangements and shall be at the rate per pound of one-half of one per cent of the published air passenger fare, with a minimum charge of twenty-five cents, and the liability of the Carrier for loss of or damage to baggage and/or personal property is limited to the amount of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) unless a higher valuation be declared and an additional charge paid therefor. Excess valuation limited to \$1000.00 on each full fare ticket.

From 40 to 55 pounds of baggage will be carried free on tickets of passengers destined to Mexico, Central and South America using Pan American Airways. Inquire of ticket agent for full details.

On tickets of transoceanic passengers 55 pounds of baggage will be carried free, or 40 pounds will be carried by plane and 100 additional pounds transported by rail express.

If you have extra trunks and cases we will take care of shipping them for you in advance by rail express. Simply give us instructions and pay us the regular Railway Express charges—we do the rest!

CHILDREN—Children under two years of age when held in arms of parent or guardian are carried free. Children over two years of age will be charged full fare.

CUSTOMS—The usual immigration and customs inspection will be made at St. Hubert Airport, northbound, and Burlington Municipal Airport, southbound.

Up to but not exceeding \$100.00 in value of articles acquired abroad by residents of the United States for personal or household use or as souvenirs or curios, but not bought on commission or intended for sale, shall be admitted free of duty: Provided, That a resident of the United States shall not take advantage of the exemption herein granted within a period of thirty days from the last exemption claimed. Such exemption shall apply only to articles so acquired by a returning resident who has remained beyond the territorial limits of the United States for a period of not less than forty-eight hours. No exemption shall be allowed in any case unless the articles claimed to be exempt were purchased or otherwise acquired merely as an incident of the trip. All articles acquired abroad during the trip must be noted on the declaration made to the United States customs officer at the time the returning resident enters the United States, or to the United States customs officers in a foreign country, just before such return to the United States if an exemption on such articles is to be claimed. Such declaration must be made, whether the declared articles accompany the returning resident, or not.

EQUIPMENT—Twin-engined Lockheed Airliners are operated on all schedules between Boston and Bangor and Boston and Montreal. Stinson Tri-motored Airliners are operated between Bangor and Caribou.

FARES—All fares are published in United States currency and are to be collected in such currency, except that when payment is made in a country other than the United States of America, the fares may be collected in the national currency of that country in an amount in such currency equivalent to the published amount in United States currency.

PASSAGE, CANCELLATION BY COMPANY—The Company reserves the right to cancel bookings before passage or en route. Pilot may remove passengers from plane or refuse them admittance to plane at any point on the route for safety or other cause. In all events the passenger's sole recourse shall be recovery of that proportion of the fare equal to the distance untraveled.

PASSAGE, CANCELLATION BY PASSENGERS—Passengers may receive a refund for passage if cancelled three hours prior to flight.

REFUNDS—Requests for refunds on tickets should be addressed to the Treasury Department, Boston-Maine Airways, Inc., Boston Municipal Airport, East Boston, Mass.

RESERVATIONS—Must be made in advance as all seats are reserved. The return portion of round trip tickets will not be honored otherwise. Reservations will not be made except upon payment of fare and are subject to Company regulations which restrict the release of portions of through space.

TIME-TABLES—These time-tables show the times at which planes may be expected to depart from and arrive at the several stations shown, and to connect with trains or other planes, but their departure, arrival, or connection at the time stated is not guaranteed. Boston-Maine Airways reserves the right to vary from the time shown in this folder without notice to the public.

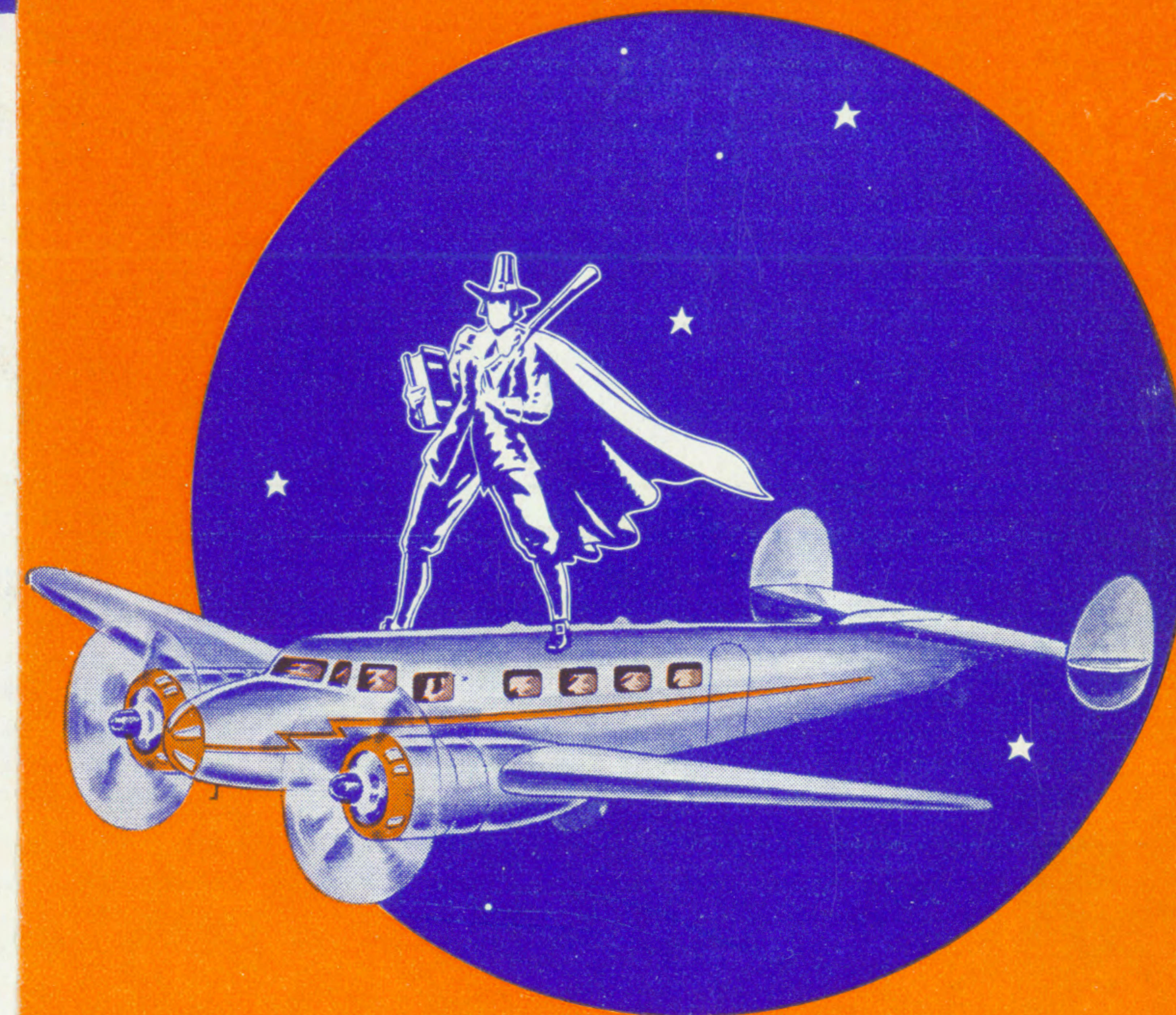
