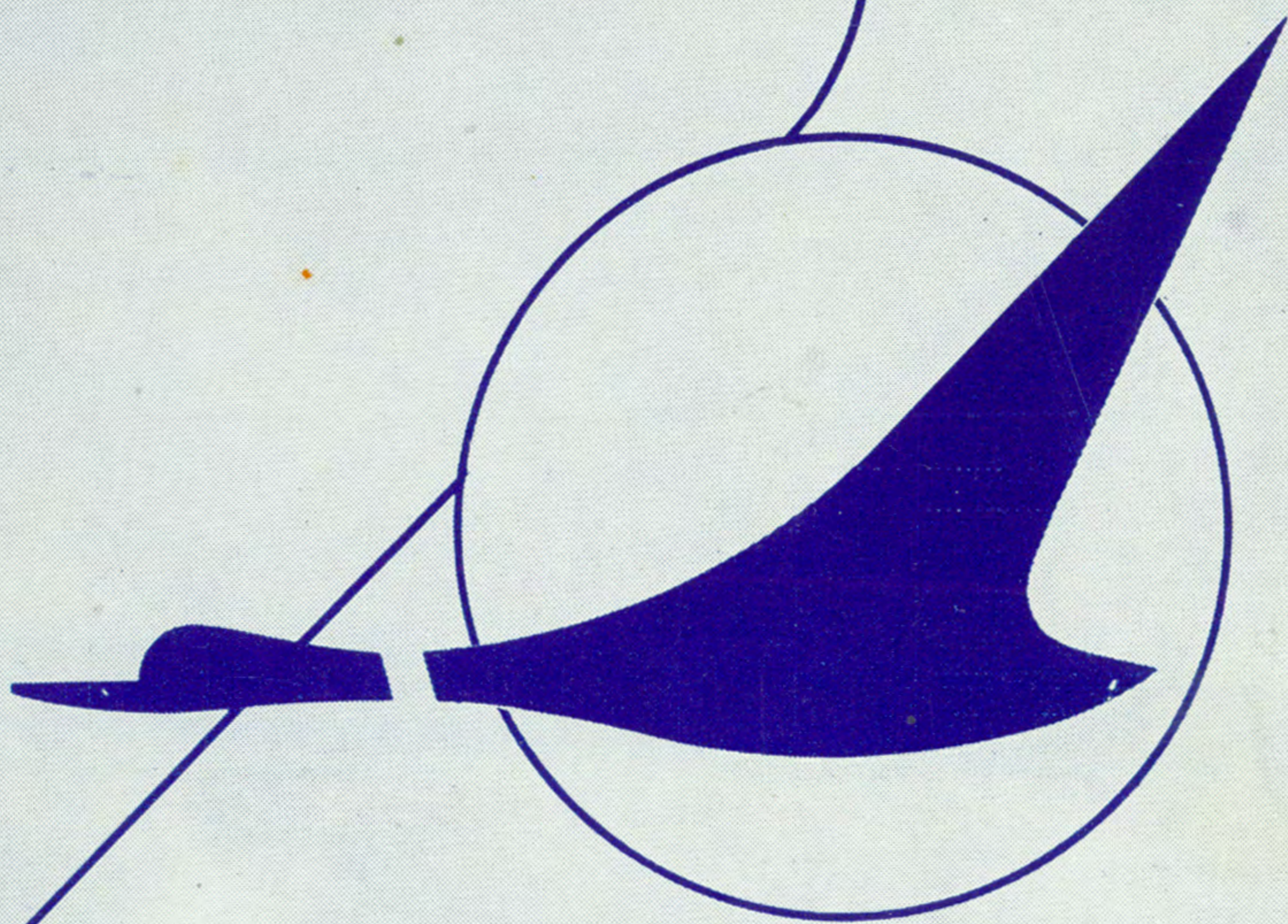

INTERESTING BRIEF FACTS ABOUT WISCONSIN CENTRAL AIRLINES

Inaugurated scheduled airline operations on February 24, 1948 — mail, passengers and cargo.

* * *

Maintains staff of 207 employees — 81% veterans of World War II — 162 employees with special aeronautical licenses — a highly skilled aeronautical organization in case of national emergency.

* * *

Achieved one of the lowest airline operating costs in the industry in second year of operation — 82¢ per plane mile in 1949 as compared to average of feeder airline industry of 92¢ per plane mile.

* * *

Conducted a \$1,395,965.92 business at a profit in 1949, in second year of operation.

* * *

Carried 32,630 passengers in 1949, a 186% increase over number of passengers carried in 1948. 46% of this total were connecting passengers to and from other airlines. (Passenger traffic first 3 months of 1950 exceeds first 5 months of 1949).

* * *

Carried 20,594 ton-miles of air mail and air parcel post in 1949. 78% increase over 1948. (First 3 months of 1950, 96% ahead of first 3 months of 1949).

* * *

Carried 22,303 ton-miles of air express in 1949 — 60% increase over 1948. (First 3 months of 1950, 132% ahead of first 3 months of last year).

* * *

Serving 26 cities through 20 airports in Wisconsin, Minnesota, Illinois and Upper Michigan — cities served have a total population of 6,750,000. Operates 1,362 miles of route with scheduled operation of 5,970 plane miles per day — 180,000 plane miles per month.

* * *

Owens and operates the most extensive private airway (navigational aid) in this country. Built at cost of \$150,000 — permits instrument (bad weather) operation to every air-

port on its system. Airway is 1,699 miles long, greater than the distance from New York to Denver.

* * *

First airline in this country to operate exclusively on new (Very High Frequency) static-free radio communications system.

* * *

Owens and operates 10 weather stations — U. S. Weather Bureau approved — aeronautical weather available at any Wisconsin Central station as a public service. Weather observations turned over to U. S. Weather Bureau — makes for more accurate forecasting of benefit to agriculture, shipping, etc.

* * *

Serves 15 cities exclusively (only airline serving these cities) which have invested in excess of \$6,000,000 to provide airports. Airports keep open year round — weather stations and navigation aids at each airport — 12 with night lighting — immediately available to military aircraft in case of national emergency.

* * *

Awarded the Aviation Safety Award for 1948 and 1949 by the National Safety Council — has flown 3,000,000 plane miles and carried more than 50,000 passengers over 8,500,000 passenger miles with a perfect record of safety.

* * *

Future — applications being considered by Civil Aeronautics Board to add 2,518 additional miles of routes — would triple size of operation. Plan to convert to larger DC-3 equipment this summer to accommodate constantly increasing traffic.



PASSENGER INFORMATION

- **RESERVATIONS** must be made in advance. Passengers must present themselves at the airport office of Wisconsin Central Airlines at least ten minutes prior to plane departure time.
- **CANCELLATIONS:** Wisconsin Central reserves the right to cancel any booking before passage begins or enroute whenever such action is deemed advisable or necessary. In all events the passenger's sole recourse shall be the recovery of that portion of the fare equal to the distance untraveled.
- **BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE:** Forty pounds of baggage, including brief case and hand luggage, will be carried free on any ticket. Charge for excess baggage, up to fifty pounds, is 1/2 of 1 percent of the one way fare per pound, with a minimum charge of 25 cents.
- **CHILDREN'S FARES:** A child under two years of age will be carried free if held on lap. Children two years of age and under twelve will be charged one-half the applicable adult fare. Children under eight must be accompanied by an adult passenger.
- **SCHEDULES** show the time at which planes may be expected to arrive at, or depart from stations, but the Company will not be responsible for consequences arising from delays or from errors in the printed schedule. Schedules and fares shown are subject to change without notice.
- **STOPOVERS:** Within the time limit of the ticket, stopover will be permitted at any scheduled stop provided prior arrangements have been made. Passenger assumes responsibility of making necessary subsequent reservations.
- **CAB SERVICE:** For the convenience of passengers, Wisconsin Central will be glad to arrange taxi or bus transportation if notice is given ticket agent before departure of plane.

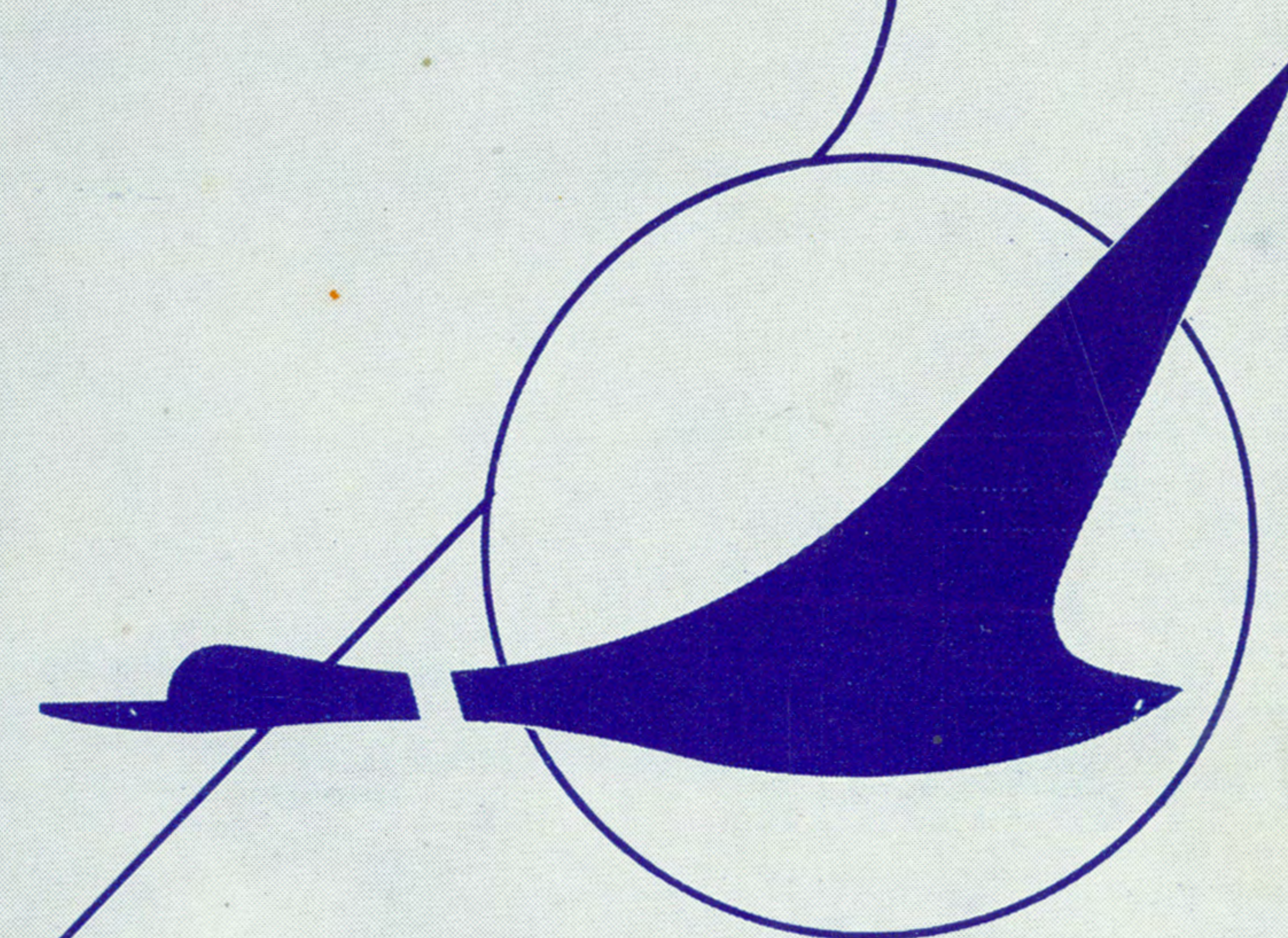

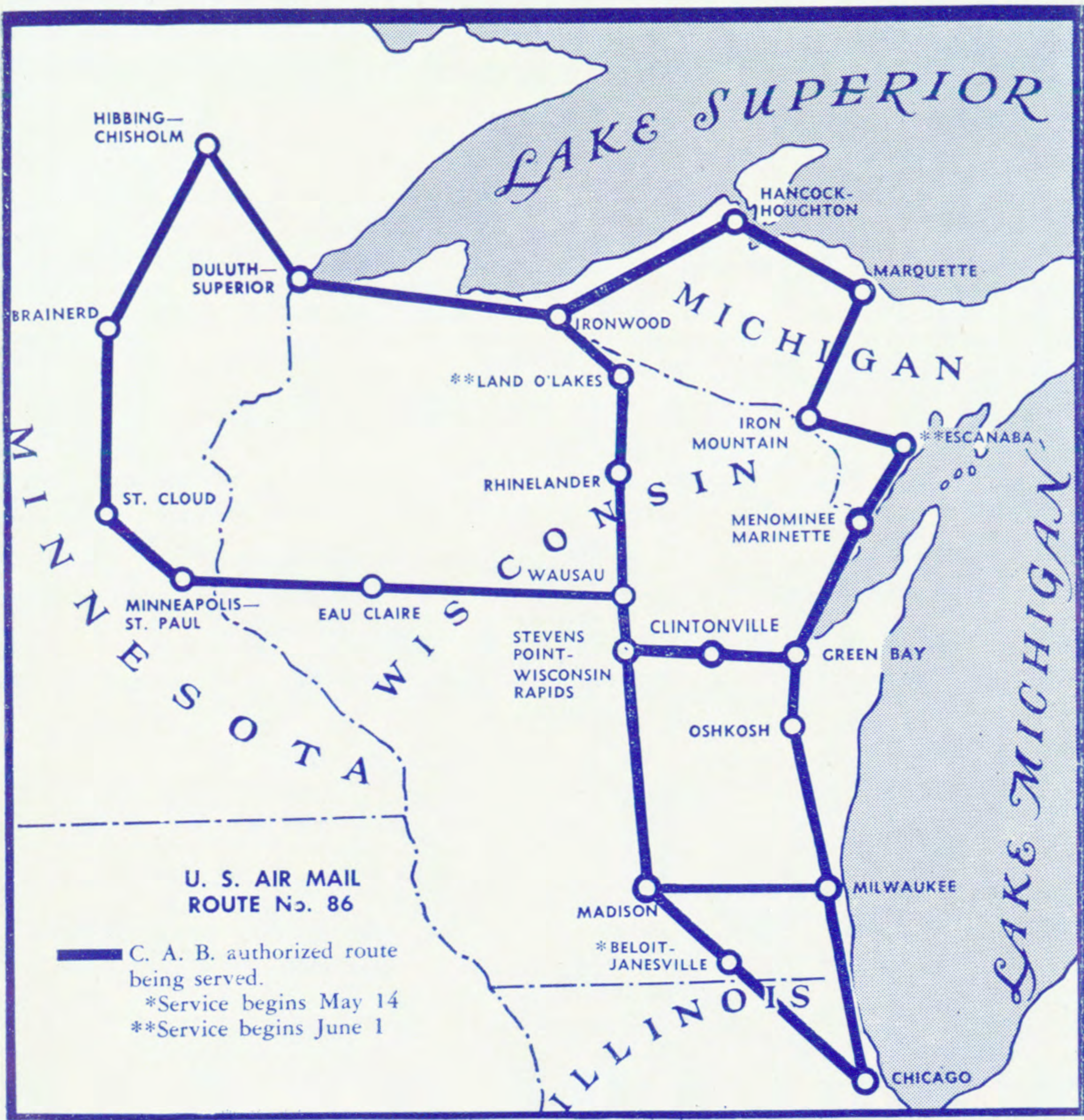
